



**Helpful Tips:**

1. Everything should be built using no tools.
2. You will have extra parts, those are spares.
3. Your first row is the most important, make sure your first row is very level and the rest will be easy.

**Step 1:**

Use zip ties ,tie line or use our Pipe and Drape Hangers to hang on top of standard pipe and drape. The Pipe and Drape Hangers are bendable and can bend to fit larger pipes. Make certain to bend all clamps back to their original shape before attaching panels.

Using black cap nuts, attach dimensional connectors in sets of 2, making sure to alternate direction (concave vs. convex).



**Step 2:**

Using white cap nuts, attach your first row of design panels to your connectors.

The columns should be spaced evenly for a uniform look as they descend.

Once your first row is complete the top row of panels should be in a pattern that alternates the direction of the panel due to the direction of the dimensional connector.



**Step 3:**

Utilizing the opposing dimensional connectors (for example, if convex on the top of the panel, use concave on the bottom). Add the connectors to the bottom of the row of panels just hung.

Once complete, every bolt hole in the panels should be filled.

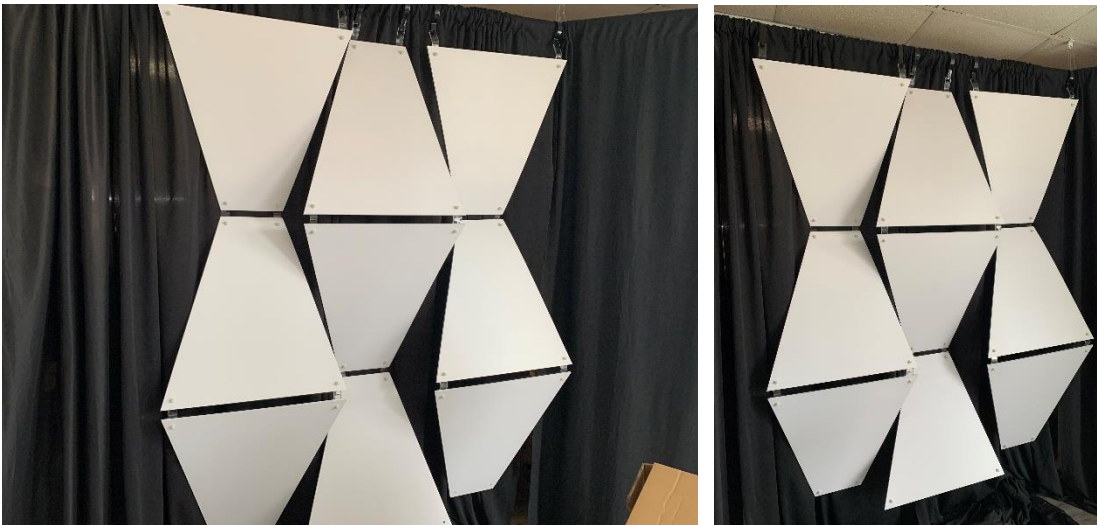
**Step 4:**

Using white cap nuts, hang additional design panels to the connectors that were just added, continuing the pattern. (for Keystone panels this will mean large side connected to large side, small to small). The top of these panels will connect to the bottom of the connectors hung in step 3.



**Step 5:**

Repeat steps 3 and 4 until you reach your desired height.

**Step 6:**

To finish your last row, insert a bolt into each open hole along the bottom of your backdrop and secure with white cap nuts.



**Step 7:**

Re-check spacing to ensure uniform lines and alternating patterns.



**Step 8:**

Enjoy your finished product.
